Cleaning service and supplies

- Cleaning service
 - Currently operating at full cost via external providers (in-house or contract)
 - From 6th of July the normal cleaners will return
- Cleaning supplies
 - We would like to continue the system we have been using.
 - The 2IC or other person to please buy the supplies for June and for July staying within the budget.
 - Some requests, where 2ICs have saved money on the budget, have come in
 - If it is within budget can we buy a new broom/mop YES
 - If it is within budget can I buy glass cleaner YES
 - Can we buy expensive toilet paper NO. THIS IS A WASTE. (You don't have to buy something that gives papercuts but we don't have the money to buy the stuff you see in the dog adverts = <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=C6EQvxjEnvQ</u>)
- Garden stuff like weed killer for the lawn
 - This can be purchased as an extra but please check with us on the cost before hand. Email us, we can consider it.
 - Grass seeds? Email us, we can consider it.
- Receipts
 - Must be kept and emailed to us. No need for fancy spreadsheets, just take a photo with your phone and that'll do.



Summary of changes

- Cleaners return from the 6 July
- In-person viewings resume subject to vetting and safety measures
 - We are still pre-vetting tenants and doing virtual viewings first.
 - Virtual viewings filter out around 80% of our in-person viewings. So if we bring 1 person to your house, imagine there were 4 other unsuitable ones (dates didn't line up/they misread the advert etc...)
- Moving in new tenants resumes subject to vetting and safety measures
- Repair visits resume in full subject to safety measures
- Social bubbles They don't change anything for shared houses. You may have guests in the garden (it is okay if they have to walk through the house to get there but keep social distancing in place).
 - Chances of transmission outside were "vanishingly small" because "the amount of dilution from fresh air is so high" Dr Chris Smith, University of Cambridge
- Our policy on guests is to mirror what the UK government has set and we request people try to follow the spirit and the letter of the law.
- Masks!!
 - We are delivering complimentary masks to each house and also taking meter readings for the houses where we have been unable to get them (50 masks per house we are giving our tenants over 2,500 masks)
 - This is so that you have a solution while you find out how to source your own masks.
 - Kindly make sure you wear them when you are going into a shop or a public space like a bus, train, or the tube
 - 10 masks per tenant, so please use them sparingly until you are able to source your own masks
- Kingdom Houses will continue to use the INS system to let you know of our visits to your property
- Since most companies will be opening up by the end of June you will have to accept that some of your housemates may return to work. You must trust them, trust that they will be careful and cautious, and know that they don't want to get sick and they don't want to make you sick.
- We must all keep offering each other dignity and respect, at times all of us have been greatly tempted to fail and many have. It is now time to renew our strength, to stay vigilant, and to keep fighting.



A reminder, just in case

- DRAINS
- \rightarrow DO NOT FLUSH WEIRD THINGS DOWN THE DRAIN
- \rightarrow We do not want to spend time unblocking drains it is very unpleasant \bigcirc
- \rightarrow 80% of drain blockages <u>are from wet wipes</u>
- \rightarrow Please only flush toilet paper, poo, and pee down the drains
- OTHER
- \rightarrow Be careful with things
- \rightarrow Don't be heavy handed with appliances (washing machine/doors etc...)

REPAIRS

- \rightarrow If an appliance breaks we may struggle to source the replacement part.
- \rightarrow So be gentle




Some news updates




England COVID-19 Deaths Increase by Actual Day in Hospital and All Settings - UPDATED 8 JUNE










Daily number of lab-confirmed cases in England by specimen date
